What should I already know?

- Pilgrimage to the river Ganges— another form of commitment.
- Different deities and their characteristics-deities may be popular for different times of needs.
- The caste system—traditional class system of human life in India—unpopular now but still present in rural India.

What will I know by the end of this unit?

Hindus believe in a universal soul or God called Brahman.

- They believe that there is a part of Brahman in everyone and this is called the Atman.
- Hindus believe that Brahman takes on many forms which some Hindus worship as gods or goddesses.
- The essence of each god is Brahman.
- These gods are sent to help people find/understand the universal God (Brahman).
- There are three main Hindu deities (the trimurti):
 Brahma –creator, Vishnu –preserver and Shiva destroyer.
- Most Hindus have a personal god or goddess to whom they pray to regularly.
- Hindus believe that Brahman is present in all things.
- They believe that Brahman is eternal and everywhere at once.
- Hindus use images and objects to portray God. Hindus do not worship these, but worship Brahman through them.
- Hindus are free to worship God in a variety of forms.

Impact on believer / daily life

- Worship can take many forms and is a very personal aspect of daily life.
- Most Hindus will worship everyday mostly at home using private shrine.
- Remembering the laws in the Vedas will help Hindus respect nature, as well as focus on their personal morality.
