



What should I already know?

- Creation story from the book of Genesis in the Bible in the Old Testament.
- God is the creator of the world according to the Bible. This is also in the Creed (the beliefs of the Christian church) used by many Christian congregations.
- In the Genesis account (Chapter 1) within the Bible, God gives the first humans the responsibility to look after the world He has created:
- "Be fruitful and increase in number; fill the earth and subdue it. Rule over the fish in the sea and the birds in the sky and over every living creature that moves on the ground."

What will I know by the end of this unit?

- The Christians concept of incarnation: God becoming man.
- Christian concept of Salvation saving mankind.
- From permanent separation from God by death and resurrection of Jesus.
- Palm Sunday is the day where Jesus rode to Jerusalem. He fulfilled Old Testament Prophecies.

Impact on believer / daily life

Links with other religions

- God as a creator (Judaism) Jewish people also believe that God created the world and everything in it in six days and rested on the seventh day.
- Chanukkah (Judaism) Both are winter festivals.
- Jesus (Judaism) Jews believe that Jesus was the son of God.
- Jesus (Islam) Muslims believe Jesus is a messenger of Allah. (He is not the son of God)
