What should I already know?

- Jesus is the son of God has the power to forgive sins.

- Christians believe that they are also forgiven of any sins.

Impact on believer / daily life

- Many Christians will be aware of and may regular say ,"
 The Lords Prayer".
- Christians ask God to forgive his or hers wrongdoing as they forgive people who have wronged them. This implies that God expects Christians to practice forgiveness towards all others.

Links with other religions

Shabbat (Judaism) - Jewish people celebrate Shabbat weekly to remember God resting on the seventh day, after he created the world. The 10 Commandments were given to Moses by God. Jews also share meals together during Shabbat.
