Year 5 have enjoyed Forest School Friday afternoons, learning about the environment and outdoor skills. Year 6 were not deterred by the rain and enjoyed their trip to Wollaton Park to participate in an Ancient Greece workshop.

As part of school's commitment to pupil's personal development. Years 3 and 4 put on a fabulous Egyptian showcase for their families, using drama as part of the Creative Collaborative project. Year 5 pupils were given the opportunity to develop their cycling proficiency through Bikeability.
