Project Based Learning 2025 - 2026 Essential Question - How do people's lives change?



UKS2 Term: Autumn

Project Overview

This term, our History lessons will focus on the Tudor period, which began in 1485 and ended in 1603, followed by the start of the Stuart era. We will explore key events from the reign of Henry VIII and examine the defining characteristics of the Elizabethan period. Using a variety of historical sources, we will make informed deductions about life during Tudor times.

In Geography, our learning will centre on the Alps. Children will develop their understanding of both the human and physical features of this mountain region while exploring the essential question: "What is life like in the Alps?" We will use a range of data collection methods to describe and investigate these features.

In Design and Technology, children will design and create an automated toy using CAM mechanisms to produce movement. Throughout the process, they will develop practical skills such as measuring, sawing, and assembling components to construct a working automaton.

Art lessons will explore the use of colour to create depth and perspective in landscape painting. Children will learn how artists use tonal variation and composition to achieve realistic effects.

Our writing units will be closely linked to our studies in History and Geography. We will begin by reading Treason by Berlie Doherty, delving into life at the court of Henry VIII and using the text as inspiration for our own historical writing.
